Introduction

This is the tenth Annual Report of the Probus Club of Templestowe Valley (Combined) Inc.

What is Probus?

Probus is an association of retired and semi-retired people who join together for the purpose of having regular opportunities to keep their minds active and to enjoy the fellowship and friendship of new friends. Probus has filled a need for today's active retirees, so much so that the growth has been phenomenal. It is now a world-wide movement in twenty three countries. The Probus Centre - South Pacific Inc., is the Administration and Service Centre for the South Pacific area and is dedicated to promoting the development of friendship and acquaintance and the advancement of intellectual interests of its membership.

We are very proud of our club, which was inaugurated in June 2003. We have 149 members and two Life Members (Kerry McInerney and Doug Hayne). Manningham Rotary Club started our club on 12 June 2003 when the inaugural meeting was held in the hall at the Ted Ajani Reserve with 62 foundation members signing up. Our club has 20 activity groups, all groups have their own coordinator with one activity leader on the committee. Our Club was incorporated in 2004 with member Doug Hayne being appointed the Public Officer. By being incorporated, any litigation needs to be directed to the incorporated body and cannot be directed to individual members. We meet at the Ajani Centre on the second Monday of the month at 9:30am.

Club Insurance

The Probus Centre – South Pacific Inc provides a universal insurance cover for members and third parties attending official and approved Club events. The Club is levied an annual fee to cover this insurance.

Probus Clubs within the Municipality of Manningham

The growth of Probus in the Municipality of Manningham has been outstanding. There are twenty two Probus Clubs in the municipality and there is a combined meeting of the Manningham Probus Interest Group twice a year with each Club sending two delegates with items of mutual interests being discussed. There are two meetings each year for Club Tour leaders, where again, touring and trip information is exchanged between leaders.

Our various Activity Leaders have also had a busy and exciting year, providing all members with a wide and varied range of outings and activities. Most activities were well supported during the year, which is due to the hard work and enthusiasm put in by Leaders and the fact that the majority of our members support them and participate in many of the broad range of activities available. Some of our Activity Leaders have been involved since the Club's beginning which is a great effort, so thank you to all our Leaders and their assistants. Treasurer's Annual Report for Year Ended 31/01/2013 – Jacob Kerseboom.

The club ended the year in a sound financial position with funds of \$5,575-28.

Although this is a decrease of some \$12- from last year, the turnover was \$420- more than the previous year. An amount of \$5,145-20 was held for activities at the end of the financial year after an annual turnover of \$50,420-.

Membership was again increased by 10 to 150 since the last annual meeting, resulting in an increase in membership and joining fees.

During the year the club purchased a lap-top computer together with a back-up drive for the purpose of enabling records to be prepared and maintained for easy retrieval and up-dating when required. The centralisation of club records will also assist with the history of the club after a change of office-bearers. The turnover of \$50,420- for our various activities groups reflect the strength of our club and the high participation rate in the many events/activities held during the year. Jacob Kerseboom, Hon.
