## 3. WELCOME:

The President welcomed the members and visitors Jo Danahay and Les Thompson. He made special mention of the return from overseas of Vice President Margaret Cornell.

#### 4. REPORTS:

#### 4.I Treasurer's Report:

The Treasurer presented her report: cash in bank \$7365.82 of which actual Club funds represented \$6144.82, the balance being money received from members for current excursions. The full report is attached to these minutes. The report was accepted on a motion from Joan Plank, seconded Gwen Young.

# 4.2 Secretary's Report:

#### 5.1 Reports on Activities:

The immediate ones were the Christmas-in-July trip to Ballarat (11/7), a tour of the Toyota factory (14/8), Valley View Estate tour and lunch (10/8); a visit to a jewellery and costume museum in Bulleen (26/8); and the Tram Boat Cruise (2/12) which has more names listed than seats available.
