# Ian Gault Open Forum

Zoning and Boundaries of New Membership Applications to our club.

"Membership of this Club shall be primarily for residents of the Manningham Council Districts".

Change the wording to

"Membership of this Club shall be primarily for residents of the three (3) City of Manningham Council Wards of Ruffey, Koonung and Heidi"

Ian gave a comprehensive over view of the reason the committee is putting this motion to members to vote on:

The closeness to each other as we get older. The suburbs of Ruffey, Koonung and Heidi have a population of 25,000 persons aged over 55 year, no fear of running out of prospective members in the future. This amendment will not affect any current member who resides outside of these boundaries, nor will it affect the 6 names we have accepted on our waiting list. Nor will it affect any current member who in the future finds it necessary to move to outside this designated area. There is the word "primarily" in clause 3(b) this would allow some discretion to be applied to any extraordinary application for membership

Increasing the Membership fee to \$40

Jacob gave an overview of the finances of the club. The forty dollars will be a yearly fee and no money to be collected on a monthly basis. This will save the counting and balancing of money each month.
