1. President Ian welcomed members

Ian gave an overview of the Evacuation Procedure for the Ajani Centre. In the event of an emergency evacuation we should exit towards Thompsons Road and gather behind the Scout Hall and wait there until the role is checked and instructions are given.

President Ian advised he had decided to postpone a test evacuation that had been planned for today.

2. Ian's Communicating Time

Ian and Doug Hayne traveled to Dingley in February to attend the Probus Clubs of Victoria quarterly Delegates meeting.

Ian reported:

Probus Concert held in November was a success but ran at a loss; admission price will increase for this year's concert. Doug requested an explanation as to why the Victorian body required approximately \$40,000 to be held in investment funds. The money is an accumulation of annual subscription which is in excess to the association's requirements. As Treasurer Ken Falconer was not present at the meeting the President Wal Fordham explained that the executive felt it necessary to hold these funds for emergencies. At the fellowship break others present advised Doug and Ian that the same question had been asked at a number of previous meetings with the same explanation given. On behalf of all Victorian Probus Clubs \$2,500 was donated to the bushfire appeal. The Manager of Envisage Travel gave a short presentation on proposed events and advised that Envisage has now merged with APT.

Matters closer to our club:

Heat Cancellation Policy: if the official forecast is 35 Celsius or above on days of a planned activity members should contact the activity leader to confirm if the activity is cancelled. If the activity does proceed members should be aware this will not be recognized as an official Probus activity. On a Total Fire Ban the scheduled Barbeque could proceed as a club activity without the BBQ cooking facilities available.

Hall Skylights are a problem when videos are shown. Council has investigated solving the problem however solutions are cost prohibitive. The skylights were installed to save electricity and on sunny days the electric lights should be turned off and natural day light utilized. This matter should be followed up by the new committee.
