11.3 Remembrance Day John Reid

John Reid spoke about this special day: 11th Hour of 11th Day of 11th Month, and his memories, annually, of when the clock struck at 11am and everything stopped for the minute of silence and then gradually started again. Remembering the horror of war.

He spoke of his and Val's visit to Gallipoli and then their experiences at the Somme as a sad beautiful landscape of open country, without animals, and every few kilometres a small wood. There were small, well tended cemeteries with about 50 graves in each. Poppies in the fields, and both big towns and small hamlets in the area. Pozieres, a small hamlet where homes are along the road and a landmark windmill, is said to have been more soaked with Australian blood than any other place in the World.

John and Val Reid both had family members involved and buried in Pozieres British Cemetery. Great Uncles of both John and Val were buried within a cricket pitch length of each other.

John mentioned the wives, mothers and families of those left behind and the struggle they had after this dreadful war.

The Australians saved Villers Bretonneaux, and the people of the town have never forgotten. There are Rue Victoria and Melbourne in honour of our soldiers.

Bob and Dawn Anderson were there a few years ago after our severe bush fires in Victoria, and the local school had newspaper clippings of the fires up on the walls of the classrooms. The residents had also given generously to the fire victims. The school has wooden carvings of Australian animals and a sign in yellow with NEVER FORGET THE

Ellen Boyd thanked John Reid and Bob Anderson for their input for our Remembrance Day segment.
