"Mercy Ships organisation that deploys hospital ships to underdeveloped countries to help counter health crises".

Tammy is a physiotherapist who has worked on the Mercy Ships in the Congo, Guinea and Senegal.

The mercy ship organisation offers healing and training in third world countries. In such countries two out of three people are denied timely surgery. They have 7/100,000 doctors and 1/100,000 dentists.

More than 1,000 volunteers from 40 different countries volunteer their services.

The organisation heals people, trains health carers and renovates facilities.

A short video revealed the dreadful plight these patients are in and slides showed the amazing transformation that can be made.

This was a most enlightening talk about a wonderful organisation.
