Jim Beggs "Proud to be a wharfie"

Jim gave us a very interesting talk about his 62 years on the Melbourne water front. He spoke of the physical hardship of the job in the early days. Talking of the 'bull days', the heartless and corrupt 'open pickup centre' where you might wait five hours and then not be offered a job.

He talked of the dangerous cargoes unloaded, especially asbestos. He traced the waterfront's progress from mechanisation to containerisation.

He also covered his role in the union movement and how negotiation and listening to the bodies who shipped goods from the wharf lead to a much better work place. Jim had written a book which covered his life long involvement with the water front. It was available for \$20
