"The Wiser Driver" program

- issues surrounding an ageing driver
- changes in road rules.

Points highlighted were: -since March 2023 mobile phones must be in a cradle. On the passenger seat incurs a fine.

- 70-80 year old drivers are the safest on the road
- motorised vehicles should not be on the footpath
- pull away if experiencing road rage
- after age 75 licences only issued for three year periods
- drive with lights on supported by research
- follow the four second rule 4 seconds between you and the car in front. Drive to allow for other people's mistakes
- take extra care at intersections and hook turns
- check tyres regularly.
- If a tram is stationary and doors are closed drive past at 10k/hr. Otherwise you cannot pass a stationary tram
- it is illegal to flash your lights at an oncoming car
- it is illegal to sit in the right hand lane if doing < 80K/hr
- having your left foot on the brake is not against the law but is discouraged.
