14 Introduction of Speaker:-

Rita Webb

The speaker for **Monday 8th September** meeting is Greg Collis-Brown. Greg is a highly experienced and well regarded musculoskeletal Physiotherapist, who has practiced physiotherapy for over 45 years.

After Greg completed his Graduate Diploma in Musculoskeletal Physiotherapy he commenced working in private practice in 1983. He continued in this role until 2024, a period of 39 years.

During this time, Physica has added two new physiotherapy clinics in the Yarra Valley and Knoxfield. Physica employs more than 30 practitioners, most of whom have a Master's Degree.

As a result, Greg and his team have grown to become one of the most respected and highly qualified physiotherapy clinics in Australia.

This talk covered all the aspects of Physiotherapy and its increasing importance to the medical profession.

For example,

A lot of work is being done in incontinence management at the moment.

Exercise management is decreasing the need for surgery, especially where knees are concerned eg the GIA:D program- a specialised exercise program for knee problems.

Falls, the biggest problem faced by the elderly today, can be managed and their incidence decreased by exercise.

Physio is having an increased profile in Oncology. Increasing exercise can reduce the risk of Breast Cancer. Bowel cancer survival rate is 71% with exercise, 57% without.
